View from the Dome

One of the great pleasures of working in the field of radionics is the opportunity to meet and spend time with the countless researchers working both in radionics and the allied arts and sciences. While many of these encounters take place one-on-one through email or the telephone, my favorites are the events that are scheduled around the world: expos, symposium, and training classes that focus on those topics that are never covered in the mainstream press or scientific literature. And while you can watch YouTube videos, listen to podcasts, or read essays written by many of the same teachers and experts who are presenting programs at these events from the comfort of your own home, **there is no substitute for an old-school face-to-face meeting**, where everyone can participate in the kind of specialized instructions and personal discussions that take place not only in the lecture halls, but also over the morning coffee, around the dinner table, or late at night with adult beverages on hand. Likewise, an Internet search can only lead you to the answer you were seeking. But sometimes it is the random vendor in the exhibit room or program by a speaker you've never heard of that will **reveal the missing link in your personal quest for truth**, the new knowledge that was not even on your radar.

A great event that took place in July of this year was the 38th U.S. Psychotronics Association conference in Glenview (Chicago), Illinois. I have a special love for the USPA since my father, KRT founder Peter Kelly, was one of the organizing members way back in 1974, and both of us have served as members of the Board of Directors of the group. It was also through the USPA that **Dad forged the partnership with radionics legend T. Galen Hieronymus** that would prove to be so pivotal in guiding the future development of the Kelly instruments and even the location of the company.

The USPA is distinct from the other groups and events in that **the focus is predominantly locked on searching for the WHY of radionics and related esoteric phenomena** – why it works, what its scientific/engineering underpinnings may be, and how we can bridge the gap between the esoteric and mainstream research communities. For KRT, this conference presents more opportunities to meet open-minded individuals who are hearing about radionics for the very first time. In many cases they are already experienced in the concepts of radiesthesia or other disciplines that utilize the power of focused intent/applied consciousness, but are unaware of **the ability of the radionic instrument to act as a “repeating station”** for frequencies that resonate with that intent, as well as to serve as a firewall between the energy field of the operator and any external forces that might be attracted to that energy.

In contrast to the U.S. Psychotronics Association conference is the *Radionics by the Masters* Symposium organized by the All Saints ministry in Rapid City, South Dakota, in October of each year. If the USPA is the "WHY" conference, **the Radionics by the Masters meeting is the "HOW" conference**. These instructors and consultants *already know* radionics works, so the programs delivered at this meeting are not especially concerned with the scientific foundations of the art, but instead remain focused on sharing practical information, techniques, and strategies that will allow instrument operators to have an immediate and positive impact on their farms, homesteads, and gardens. For example, in 2015 I delivered a program entitled "Radionics without Rates" to the 60 or so participants in the room, sharing the secrets of reagent-based broadcasting, the use of the Replicator instrument, and even how to achieve a scalar broadcast with no instrument at all using only an antenna! As an example of the impact this information made on the attendees, 8 months later at the USPA meeting **I had two individuals present me with working examples of pocket scalar devices they had created**. The first was Pennsylvania Pete's, with potentized minerals in a case surrounded by a Spurling coil and backed with a homemade scalar antenna. The very next morning I was handed one of our own gold-plated perfect spiral BETAR Coils by a friend. He'd filled the chamber behind the antenna with sand that was potentized with "peace and love," allowing that energy to be pumped forth at all times.

Registration is now underway for the 2016 Radionics by the Masters Symposium, which will begin on October 25 and 26 when I deliver a two-day Basic Radionics course at the Best Western Ramkota Hotel in Rapid City. Immediately following this workshop will be the main event – three days of speakers including Dr. Ron Barone, Robin Hermanson, Brian Besco, Marty Lucas, Tim Lippert, Scott Ertl, "Pennsylvania" Pete Radatti, George Kuepper, Cory Stover, Sarah Emond, Daniel Taylor, and yours truly! The symposium has already reached the minimum number of participants required to guarantee the event, so book *your* seat and your room today! Finally, back in February of 2016 I co-organized a new event that was so successful that it will certainly be a regular part of the calendar for many seasons to come. **The Radionics Winter Classic was a series of workshops of hands-on radionics training** that Marty Lucas and I delivered in the heart of the nation in Des Moines, Iowa, with three courses conducted back-to-back-to-back: a two-day Basic Radionics course, a one-day Intermediate Radionics course, and a single-day Advanced Radionics course. Marty and I co-taught these workshops, with me taking the lead on the Basic course and him taking charge of the two workshops to follow. **We packed the room for all four days**, with some folks participating in all three workshops and some folks taking only the courses that served their interests and/or skill levels. If you cannot make it to South Dakota in October, you definitely need to attend the winter workshop in Des Moines, scheduled for February 18 to 21, 2017.
